Public Works

Snow and Ice Control

The City of Edgerton treats and plows roads during winter storms. Different types of moisture require different methods of treatment. Public Works evaluates each event on length, intensity, temperature and time of day to determine the most effective method of treatment for that event. Roads are prioritized based on traffic counts and how heavily the street is used.

Any time the City receives two (2) inches in frozen precipitation, a snow event may be declared. **When a snow event happens, all cars must be moved off the street.** Cars that are not moved off the street may be towed to make room for plows.

Residents are notified of a snow event through Notify JoCo, which will text or call residents based upon their preferences. You can sign up for Notify JoCo by going to notifyjoco.org. You can also see the notifications on the City's Facebook page and website.



Edgerton Community Food Pantry



The Edgerton Community Food Pantry is located at New City Church along Morgan Street/56 Hwy, just west of the Dollar General.

The food pantry is open from 10am-12pm on the third Saturday of every month. This month's food pantry is on January 17. Volunteers will load food in vehicles.

The food pantry is available to every family in the Gardner Edgerton USD 231 district. Food donations can be dropped off in the blue bin at City Hall or at The Greenspace. Monetary donations can be mailed to P.O. Box 95, Edgerton, KS 66021.

City Council

City Council Sworn In Following November Election

The City of Edgerton installed the re-elected members of governing body on Thursday, December 11.

Voters re-elected Mayor Donald Roberts and Council Members Joshua Lewis and Bill Malloy on November 4. City Clerk Dusti Callahan administered the oaths of office for each person.

Council members then elected Clay Longanecker as Council President. This is his fifth term as Council President. The Council President presides over meetings if the mayor is absent. To get to know your Council Members, check out edgertonks.org/City-Council-profiles.

Members of the City Council are responsible for discussing and guiding the overall direction of the City through the adoption of City policy, ordinances, and resolutions. Each member of the Governing Body is elected at-large and serves a term of four years.

LIEAP Applications Open January 20

Federal funding was approved for the 2026 Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) season.

The program, administered through the Kansas Department of Children and Families, helps eligible Kansas households pay a portion of their primary home heating costs during the winter season with a one-time per year benefit. Applications will be accepted beginning at 8 a.m. on Jan. 20, 2026, and must be received by DCF March 31, 2026.

 Carbon monoxide (CO) is a gas you cannot see, taste, or smell. It is often called **"the invisible killer."**

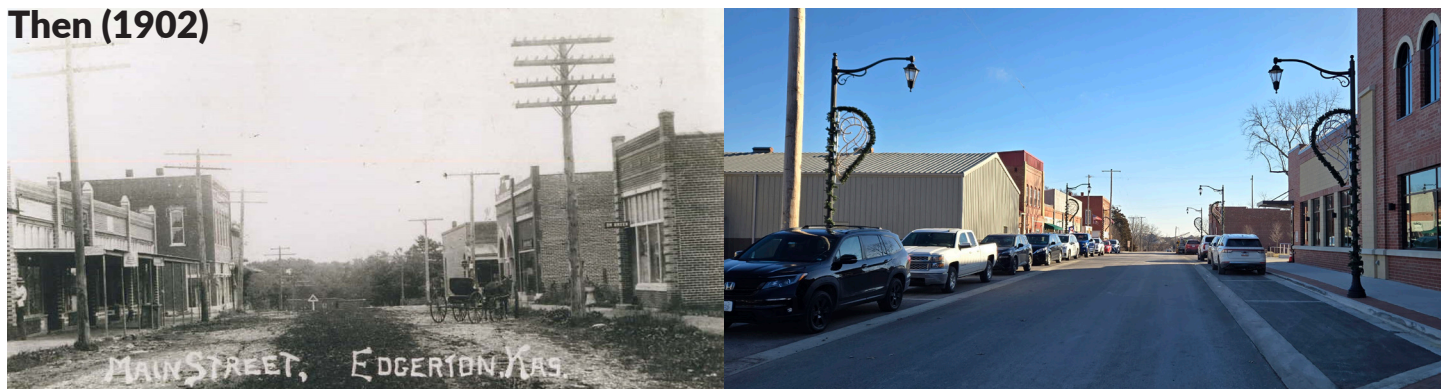
 **Install and maintain CO alarms** inside your home to provide early warning of CO.
