City-Wide Garage Sale and Clean-Up

Spring is the perfect time to clear out your space.

Coming up on May 8th, the City-Wide Garage Sale will take place. If you plan to host a sale, please let City Hall know so that we can get your sale posted on the map that will be available for bargain shoppers. The deadline to get your sale listed is Tuesday, May 4. This year, the Venture Scouts will be hosting a sale in the downtown greenspace at 319 E Nelson St. Chris Cakes will also be selling breakfast boxes for \$5 and free coffee for shoppers who stop by.



On March 15th, clear out the garage and get rid of any extra junk during the City-Wide Clean-Up. Crews with Gardner Disposal will be coming around that Saturday to collect bulky items. Furniture, appliances without CFCs, carpet and construction debris can be placed curbside. No concrete is allowed. All items must be able to be lifted by two people. Seniors over the age of 60 can request help moving an item. Volunteers are available, but you must contact City Hall at 913.893.6231 by noon on Wednesday, May 5 to sign up for help.

Project Updates

207th Street Grade Separation

Work continues on the 207th Street Grade Separation Project. Crews from Pyramid Construction are installing the piers for the new bridge. Daily road closures along Co-Op Road are expected to continue for a couple more weeks. This project remains on track to be substantially complete before the end of the year. Glendell Acres Park

Edgerton City Council members will select the team to design the renovations for Glendell Acres park during the May 27 meeting. The community will have an opportunity later this year to share your ideas for the future of the park. This will be the second park to be fully renovated in Edgerton in the last few years.

The Edgerton Community Food Pantry will be open from 10 a.m. to noon on Saturday, May 15. It's located at the corner of 4th and Hulett, across the street from the United Methodist Church. Volunteers will load items into the vehicle.

Did You Know?

With pool season arriving shortly, you may be considering installing a backyard pool. A permit is required for any pool over 24 inches deep. You must also have a fence around the pool that is 4-6 feet tall and cannot be climbed. The building permit and inspections are required to make sure your pool is safe. Host A Block Party On Your Street

With the weather warming up, now is the perfect time to plan a block party with your neighbors. Drag the grill out front, pull out the lawn chairs, and start chatting with the people who live near you!

The City of Edgerton has a block party program, where you and your neighbors can sign up to close down your street. You must apply at least 15 days in advance and get approval from 75% of the property owners in the area within the street closure area. The City will provide door hangers to help notify everyone about the block party. All City ordinances are still in effect and neighbors must clean-up the public spaces at the end of the event.



JoCo FD#1: Severe Weather Safety

Spring is the height of severe storm season here in Kansas. We want to make sure you know how to stay safe during tornadoes and other severe weather.

TORNADOES



In homes or small buildings

- Go to the basement or small interior room
- Cover your head
- Stay away from windows

In mobile homes or vehicles

- Do not try to outrun the tornado in your car
- Get to the nearest shelter, but if a shelter is not available, stay in your vehicle with your seat belt on. Put your head down below the windows and cover it with your hands, OR
- Lie flat in a ditch and cover your head with your hands

FLASH FLOODS:



- Move to higher ground and stay away from storm drains, ditches and streams
- Never walk or swim in flood waters
- Don't drive into water or around barricades, especially at night. Turn Around, Don't Drown!
